

DFWI members were suitably impressed by the juxtaposition of our hotel to the iconic landmark Liver building and the river Mersey which afforded us a (Liver) bird's eye view as we ate breakfast the following morning. Some of us were lucky enough to experience the same view from our hotel rooms!

Following the last two years of disruption this year's meeting would be the first time that proceedings would be conducted in a hybrid format with delegates and observers attending the actual meeting or via a live streaming on the internet and although the actual attendees were fewer in number than previous years it didn't seem to dampen the enthusiasm especially when singing Jerusalem or the national anthems. The business of the day has been well documented on the MyWI website and in WI Life magazine and we hope that you have received the accounts from your WI delegates too.

Although, as Ann Jones stated in her address, this format of hybrid annual meetings will now, almost certainly, remain with us for the foreseeable future in order to enhance the accessibility to more members, there is still nothing to compare to the atmosphere of hundreds of WI members from all over the countries of Wales and England as well as the islands coming together to celebrate the unique camaraderie that is the WI. Ann Jones also exhorted us to go out and ask other women we meet who are not members "why are they not members'? in order for us to understand and alter perceptions and myths that may be inhibiting women from joining.

Why not try this in your own communities and see if you can increase your membership by changing the way your WI is perceived?

This year's resolution concerning women and girls and the diagnosis and treatment of ADHD and autism was discussed with many poignant and well thought out points of view from both professional representatives and members from around the country. It was passed with 96% majority and the afternoon continued with our main speaker, Sarah Clarke OBE, aka Black Rod, talking about her career both in Westminster and at the LTA, Wimbledon.

**Combe Martin WI** members took part in <u>The Hunting of the Earl of Rone</u> which is an annual custom, unique to the village of Combe Martin on the coast of North Devon taking place each year over the Spring Bank Holiday weekend, at the end of May.

Over the four days of the weekend, the Grenadiers, Hobby Horse, Fool and Villagers hunt, each day, through the village for the 'Earl of Rone', finally finding him on the Monday night.

The Hunting of the Earl of Rone is one of over 500 unique calendar customs that take place at various times of year throughout England. Banned in 1837, for licentiousness and drunken behaviour, the Hunting of the Earl of Rone revival came back to the village in 1974 and returned to its proper time, under the Earl of Rone Council, in 1978.
