For many of you this is the time of year when you are closing your books and creating your accounts for the year.

We are recommending that all WIs change to a year end account finishing in December from the end of this year, so for 2023 only you will have two sets of accounts to complete.

If you have questions or concerns re how you can spend your money please make contact as someone at DFWI will

be able to help.

Coming out with this mailing is a budget form—all WIs should have one as it is the only way to know if you need to fundraise or if you can afford to offer money off your affiliation fees (WI portion only) for your members.

I have also been in touch with NFWI about bank accounts as many of you are still having difficulties. The reply I have received is:

Over the past year we have consistently been looking for ways we can assist in this area, such as by providing letters for WIs who wish to open bank accounts and providing new guidance for the ever-changing issues with banks (such as the tax declaration related forms many WIs have received in the past couple of months).

However at a structural level unfortunately we have been unable to find inroads with the banks about what is ultimately a business decision. We will continue to try to help where we can on this matter.

#### Spring is coming ......and so are Annual Meetings!

WI committees should now be thinking ahead to their Annual Meetings in April and May. Annual report forms will be landing in your Secretary's email inbox by the end of the month so please look out for them and contact us if you do not receive one. Treasurers should close their books at least six weeks before their Annual Meeting and contact their IFE to arrange a date for their accounts to be examined. If you have any concerns about your accounts contact your IFE before handing over so that they can be sorted in good time.

The Secretary will be putting together the Annual Report on behalf of the committee. This should be an overview of the year highlighting any community connections, outings and events and of course highs and lows of the year.

Don't forget to invite tellers to oversee the election process. This can be arranged with neighbouring WIs or contact your Adviser if you would like her to attend. It's not too early to be thinking of seeking nominations for your committee positions and in particular those who are willing to stand for election as President and take on the roles of Secretary and Treasurer, (please see details of our training workshops below). If you have concerns about any aspect of the Annual Meeting do contact your Adviser for help or advice.

It is not advisable to have a speaker at the Annual Meeting so why not have a special social time with an interesting activity? Discuss outings and events with members, or gather ideas to help your WI develop. Make it enjoyable and fun and show that it is an important part of running your WI to make it the WI the members want it to be - and there is always cake!

Subscriptions for 2023/2024 are due on the 1st April and can be paid by cheque, cash or BACS. Please remember that only paid up members are eligible to vote or stand for election at the Annual Meeting.

We are working with a partner organisation to use our devonwi email system and related packages more effectively. Soon all WIs will only receive emails through their generic WI email address which can be shared by your officers. This will help with GDPR issues too. This will also mean that you will be able to access DFWI forms through Sharepoint.

If this makes you nervous or anxious we will ensure that support and training is available.

### **Committee Information and Roundup**

Our Committees are the driving force behind the events we publish and comprise of a Board member plus any WI member with an interest in the topics covered by the Committee. Some of the teams are small and are struggling to organise events and we are reviewing all of them to make sure we can offer something different to all WI members in Devon. At times our events are so popular that they are oversubscribed and have to go to a ballot, at other times they are under subscribed and would run at a loss so they have to be cancelled. As you may know, ovarian cancer is a devastating disease, with only 3 in 10 women diagnosed with ovarian cancer living beyond 10 years. We are determined to change this and supercharge our efforts to transform survival rates so that by 2032, at least half of women with ovarian cancer live for 10 years.

By participating in Walk in Her Name, you will be supporting our efforts to increase knowledge about ovarian cancer symptoms, develop ground-breaking treatments, and ensure that women have access to the best care regardless of their age, ethnicity, or location. I know these things align closely with the WI's **See the Sign's** campaign.

During the month of March, the official Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month, we are asking our supporters to walk a cumulative total of 100km each. This impressive challenge can be fit around your lifestyle, or be completed through treks with family, friends or other WI members.

Walkers will be helping to turn the tide on ovarian cancer, helping to save the lives of more mothers, sisters, and friends. I hope that you will join us in this important cause and help raise awareness and funds to support ovarian cancer research.

#### Jean Hoskin - This is your WI Life!

VL Approximately when did you become a member of Christow WI and what are your memories of that very first meeting?

JH My first meeting was in 1961 I think and to be honest I have no memories of it!

VL Can you recall any of the other members? What sort of women were they?

JH Yes, other ladies of my age, mid 20's, with young families. The meetings were in the evening and there were village people from all different walks of life and all ages.

VL What is your most favourite memory from those early days of belonging to Christow WI?

JH It was a good way to meet other women and I feel that it helped in some cases to alleviate loneliness. Horizons were broadened, confidence built, new skills learnt, fun and some frivolity - I remember a fashion show we had of 'Notable Ladies in History' - Wow, you should have seen some of the outfits produced!

VL The WI has always been a campaigning organisation. Which campaign topics have meant the most to you and why?

JH In 1964 there was a campaign to ban smoking in public places and warnings on health issues, another was the introduction of cervical smear tests. Do you remember Tony Blair meeting his match at a WI AGM when he was accused of being political at a non-political organisation, the slow hand clap? I don't think Cheri was a WI member!

VL What do you think the WI will be like in another 90 years? Do you really think that it could keep going that long and what do we need to keep it evolving and growing?

JH In another 90 years' time? Well I think that it is possible, surely there is a need for such organisations. I am sad that Denman no longer exists and feel that it was a very bad decision. Talking to my youngsters seeking new ideas surprisingly they highlighted the need for education in schools to understand money management, taxation, national insurance, interest rates, also, to be taught good basic cooking skills. Finally, I would like to say how fortunate we are here at Christow to have these enthusiastic young members full of new ideas but also so thoughtful to we old stagers.

VL Thank you Jean. We are very lucky to have you showing us the ropes and forming such strong foundations for our WI to continue to build on.
