**Fundraising Guidelines** 

NFWI have produced some new Fundraising Guidance as part of their review of all procedures in WI land. There are some changes which reflect the flexibility requested by WIs. NFWI have worked with a legal team io make a check of what is permissible under Charity Commission rules.

The revised policy opens opportunities for members to make their own decisions about the charities they support, in line with the organisation's charitable objects, including support for **national and international charities**.

support for national and international charities. It is hoped that this change will be welcomed by our WIs and help enhance the good we can all do across the organisation, supporting national and international causes. Please note that any charities supported by WIs, whether local, national or international, must still fit with the WI's charitable objects. This does mean that support for animal charities for instance is still not permissible.

The new guidance is available on MyWI and in the members login section on the DFWI website.

#### **RESOLUTIONS NEWS**

NFWI is in Stage 3 of the Resolutions' cycle from November to February 2023. The proposed resolutions have been debated and shortlisted. They will be announced shortly and then Federations and WIs will be able to discuss the options in preparation for the vote to decide the topic for the 2022/23 campaign.

#### **CAMPAIGN NEWS**

'Women and Girls with ASD & ADHD - under-identified, under-diagnosed, misdiagnosed, under-supported' is the latest Campaign. A Campaign Toolkit is available from NFWI Public Affairs Department if you require more information.

The WI is also supporting the **Warm This Winter** campaign and lobbying the government for more financial support on energy bills for the most vulnerable, including an increase in home insulation and development of green energy. There is more information in the WI magazine WI Life ( P24 October 2022).

There is great concern from all our members about the **Cost of Living Crisis**. NFWI has set up My WI **Cost of Living Hub** at MyWI which lists useful advice and resources to share with others. Your WI may also wish to consider if there is anything locally that you could do to help.





The Membership Communication System (MCS) is the most important tool at all levels of the WI.

Therefore it is important that the information stored there is accurate.

**Dual members**: It seems that some MCS Reps believe they do not have the authority to add a Dual member to their WI's database record. This is not the case. If the Dual member has Full membership at another WI in Devon, then she can be entered as a Dual member by the MCS Rep of the second WI. This is explained in the MCS User Guide updated Sept 2021: see Item 4 How to Add a Dual Member on pages 9-11. This user guide is available to view and/or download from the MCS (top right of the screen) and within the My WI website at <a href="https://mywi.thewi.org.uk/running-your-wi/mcs-reps">https://mywi.thewi.org.uk/running-your-wi/mcs-reps</a> (or by entering 'MCS user guide' in the website search box).

However, there are two scenarios where I need to be involved:

- if someone is already a member at two WIs and switches her Full and Dual memberships, as was often the case during last April's membership renewals;
- if someone retains her membership at a WI within another federation.
