Training for Presidents and Secretaries

If you are new to your position as a President or Secretary on your WI committee this is an opportunity to receive training to help you in your new role. There will also be an opportunity to meet other Presidents and Secretaries. If you are experienced in your role, we would still encourage you to book a place as we will be covering recent updates. Information regarding a series of workshops starting in October is available on the DFWI website (www.devonwi.org.uk). Flyers with further details will be sent to each WI shortly.

We've done our homework!

Have you ever wondered what happens to those Annual Reports and Financial Statements that are presented for adoption by your committee at your Annual Meetings? They come to us, your Advisers, and they become our 'Homework' for August when we go through them all one by one, learning more about your events and activities during the previous year, and noting any speakers you particularly recommend, or any byelaws or change of officers. The Financial Statements give a valuable insight into your fundraising efforts, and how those funds are being spent to benefit your members. The accounts will have been examined, ideally by one of our team of Federation independent financial examiners (IFEs). This is to ensure not only that they balance, but also that all expenditure is in accordance with the requirements of the WI Constitution and the Charity Commission. At present we have a team of only 15 IFEs, but with 160 WIs throughout the county we would really like to recruit a few more to be able to offer their services to all WIs. If you think this might interest you, do please contact our IFE Coordinator Maureen Hunter (m.hunter@devonwi.org.uk) for further details of the training available.

The WI is here to inspire you.....

As Advisers we are so heartened to see WIs getting back to some sort of normal with a full programme of speakers and additional activities. Where a WI doesn't have enough for a lively subgroup they have been buddying up with a neighbouring WI. Several WIs have arranged a walk together, or a coffee/lunch together.

The WI is what you make it, your WI members should enjoy their monthly meetings with a speaker, refreshments, and social activity, try to have a variety of additional activities such as lunch clubs, book clubs, coffee and a walk and craft clubs. Liaise with neighbouring WIs to give a wider choice and consult your WI members to identify what their interests are, encourage members to suggest ideas to their committee, perhaps have a suggestion box. It is important for all members to be involved in the decisions regarding WI activities. Is your WI all you want it to be?

Make sure you advertise your upcoming meeting so that visitors can come from the local community, they may even join!



The Membership Communication System (MCS) is the most important tool at all levels of the WI.

Therefore it is important that the information stored there is accurate.

For those of you who may remember, or have kept a copy of, the Data Protection for MCS Representatives dated 2017, please note that this is NO LONGER CURRENT. NFWI have now superseded this document with the MCS Code of Conduct V1.4 July 2022. This can be viewed and/or downloaded from the link at the bottom of the MCS home page.

On another matter, there have been queries recently about WI monthly meeting details not being accurate on the WI's national and federation websites. This very important information can be edited by each MCS Rep on her WI's 'Basic Details'. This is the first page of each WI's database record and is headed: 'WI's Details – Name of WI'. Any edits to this page should be automatically (but not immediately) effected on the national website – and don't forget that this information on the national website is replicated on Devon's website. If any edit is not reflected in these websites in a timely manner, please let me know so I can follow up the matter with NFWI.

Sir Joshua Reynolds (Plympton) WI presented Senior Sister Nicky Crosbie from the South West Haematology Unit a cheque for the Plymouth and District Leukaemia Fund at their annual meeting in May.

Nicky gave them a very interesting talk about the past, present and future of the work that has been enabled and supported by the fund.

The Plymouth and District Leukaemia Fund was established in 1983 with the aim of raising money to provide comprehensive care locally for people with leukaemia and other blood disorders. This was at a time when most patients would have had to

travel to London for treatment, often being hundreds of miles away from their families.

One of their members was having to travel with her son to London for treatment. The family and the consultant at that time believed that this had to change and so PDLF was created to ensure care could be provided much closer to home.

The money presented was raised from small donations, a speaker who donated his fee, a raffle, and prize money from entering a local quiz.

Making the most of the sunny weather, a number of **Post Meridian WI** members took a walk along the Stover Canal path, which leads to the inevitable tea gardens. The canal itself was opened in 1792 to serve the local ball clay industry until it closed some 150 years later. It runs for almost 2 miles from Jetty Marsh to Ventiford Basin. Over intervening years it had become derelict, but

in 1999 the Stover Canal Society was formed, their mission being to restore and preserve the canal. On the walk there is much evidence of the hard work carried out, and many points of interest relating to the canal's history. It is a very rural and pretty walk, with the promise of a lovely cuppa before the return journey.
