
CHAIRMAN'S COMMENT

Hello did you enjoy the Great British Spring Clean in March? I know that some WIs took part in a litter pick, which of course is great news as Keep Britain Tidy (the original) was a WI campaign in 1954 - yes I know litter is still a big issue and one that we will continue to work against.

In May we have two things to consider and they are linked. One is World Bee Day on the 20th and the second is the No Mow May initiative to help the wildflowers and in particular to benefit our pollinators. By not mowing your lawn it is possible that nectar could be provided for 10 times more pollinators than if you did mow it. Take a look around your area too as many churches and councils are now involved in this initiative. Both of these can also be considered as supporting our own SOS Bumblebees campaign which the WI launched in 2009 .

The NFWI urges its members, the wider public, local authorities and Government to make, support and promote applications for official designated bathing sites on appropriate stretches of rivers in their area. This will be as instrumental to the clean up of rivers as it has been for water quality improvement at coastal beaches.

Post Meridian WI welcomed Newton Bushel Cotswold Morris whose dancers and musicians gave them an evening of social history, fun, laughter, not to mention a bit of exercise for those who accepted the invitation to join in the last dance. Much confusion followed!

Their spokesman Steve outlined the many origins of folk and Morris dances, going back to the Moorish people and developing through to present times with diverse styles of dance and musical accompaniment adopted by the people of particular regions of the country.

Steve demonstrated some of the "stepping" moves,. playing along with basic penny whistle and drum, Anglo concerting, one row melodion then slightly larger accordion.

Through the ages the tunes had to be put to memory as most of the players were unable to read, or to write, music. He gave possible explanations for the bells, hankies, sticks and arm movements which represent the Cotswold style of Morris. Bells etc may have been to scare evil spirits or other threats and the sticks might just have a fertility connection.

Newton Bushel Morris are a mixed side and it was explained that ladies have long been involved in the Morris tradition. This has in particular been the case following WW1. when so many of the menfolk were lost in battle. The WI really enjoyed the music,

dance and information.





Shaldon & Ringmore WI enjoyed a visit to The Garden House at Buckland Monachorum near Yelverton recently. They went to experience the Snowdrop Walk and were amazed at the variety of flowering plants on show. The ladies had a guided walk led by the Head gardener and saw different varieties of snowdrops, camellias, hellebores, miniature narcissi and leucojem (similar in appearance to snowdrops but a different genus) among others. WI Insurance

All WIs are covered for their normal meetings and for stalls at fetes etc. Most additional groups are covered such as craft, walking, book group etc. Anything extra eg climbing, parachute jumps would have to be additional cost requested specifically or under the trainers.

WIs are also covered under Public Liability Insurance for any goods they may sell at fetes or provide at meetings

They are also covered under their Employer Liability Insurance for asking volunteers to move chairs etc or help in the kitchen. Some WIs still believe that members cannot help in the kitchen if they are over 80. This is not true. All ages are covered.

Another Covid casualty — Our Centenary Challenge

Before lockdown, DFWI set a challenge to do something for nature so Lewtrenchard **WI** decided to create a nature trail on a piece of land in the centre of Lewdown which, back in the 1890's, had been given to the community for the use of the children. The project has been protracted, like many things, due to Covid.

Apart from some grass cutting, nothing had been done with the area, known as The Rampsonwillis, for over a century. At the far end there is a copse with a spring and over the years this area had been used as a dumping ground for garden waste. Lonicera hedging had really taken hold and they had to remove over 20 dumpy bags full. They then spent a very enjoyable meeting making bird and bat boxes from kits made up by one of their members, Karen Alexander, and these are now in place. They have also been raising funds for a picnic table for the grassy area to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, and have recently planted a rowan tree for the Queen's Green Canopy. The area has now become a real asset to the village. At present they are in the process of creating a website so that children can scan a QR code to find what to look out for on the trail.
